



# Junior Faculty Small Grants Program

## **Program Overview**

The overall goal of EMPOWER-TZ is to strengthen research capacity to address the burden of surgical disease, short- and long-term outcomes of surgery, and rehabilitation needs in humanitarian settings within Tanzania. Specifically, this grant has dedicated resources for a small grants program (awards up to \$3,000 each) to support early-career faculty projects that focus on these themes and context areas. Acceptable proposals can be broadly defined and include traditional quantitative or qualitative research, as well as advocacy, anthropology, monitoring & evaluation, and implementation science projects.

## **Eligibility & Requirements**

To be eligible to apply, the applicant must be one of the following:

- Tutorial Assistants at MUHAS
- Assistant Lecturers and Lecturers at MUHAS
- Medical Officers at the Tanzania Red Cross Society

In your application submit the following documents:

- 1. Cover Letter (max 1 page, font size 11)
  - a. Provide a brief narrative of your background/qualifications, necessity of the project to study site, mentorship plan, and how project fits into your current career goals
- 2. Project Proposal (max 3 pages, excluding references, font size 11)
  - a. Should include background, proposal aims and their relevance to the partner/project site, methodology/analytic plan, outcomes of interest, proposed timeline, and anticipated budget (itemized)
- 3. Curriculum Vitale (max 2 pages, font size 11)
- 4. One Letter of Recommendation from faculty mentor/advisor
- 5. One Letter of Support or Project Endorsement from your project site or community partner (as applicable)
- 6. Copy of IRB approval or plan for obtaining IRB approval (if required for your project)

### **Junior Faculty Small Grants Program**

#### General

1. Objective

#### 2. Eligibility (Applicants must be currently affiliated with MUHAS)

- a. Tutorial Assistant at MUHAS
- b. Assistant Lecturers and Lecturers at MUHAS
- c. Medical Officers at the Tanzania Red Cross Society

#### 3. Requirements

- a. Cover Letter (max 1 page, font size 11)
  - i. Provide a brief narrative of your background/qualifications, necessity of the project to study site, mentorship plan, and how project fits into your current career goals
- b. Project Proposal (max 3 pages, excluding references, font size 11)
  - i. Should include background, proposal aims and their relevance to the partner/project site, methodology/analytic plan, outcomes of interest, proposed timeline, and anticipated budget (itemized)
- c. Curriculum Vitae (max 2 pages, font size 11)
- d. One Letter of Recommendation from faculty mentor/advisor
- e. One Letter of Support or Project Endorsement from your project site or community partner (as applicable)
- f. Copy of IRB approval or plan for obtaining IRB approval, if required for your project

#### 4. Amount

a. Up to \$3,000

#### 5. Expectations if Awarded

- a. Necessary IRB/ethics approval prior to data collection
- b. Mid-award cycle project update in the form of a written report (template to be provided)
- c. Written summary (report) and oral presentation at EMPOWER-TZ annual symposium

- d. Acknowledgement of EMPOWER-TZ grant in all project presentations and/or publications
- e. Completion of project within 24 months of award date

#### **Criteria for Evaluating Proposals**

- Relevance to the study site (i.e., project seeks to address issues of importance to the study site)
- Clear research questions/objectives
- Feasibility and sustainability of research objectives within the context and potential constraints of study site
- Rigorously developed methodologies for data collection and analysis
- Relevant research experience
- Strong letter(s) of support from mentors Multidisciplinary proposals are encouraged
