Introduction

A 5 working days course to equip trainees with the necessary skills, knowledge, and attitudes that will enable them to effectively identify, assess, and report ADRs, Adverse Events Following Immunization, Medication Errors, poor quality products, and medical devices, and other related problems and take appropriate action to improve patient's well-being and public health.

Course outlines

The course focuses on topics essential to effective pharmacovigilance, including:

- i. Concept of pharmacovigilance.
- ii. Overview of adverse events and adverse drug reactions.
- iii. Pharmacovigilance structure and responsibilities of stakeholders.
- iv. Regulatory and legal requirements in pharmacovigilance
- v. Good pharmacovigilance practice (PV system master file, risk management plan)
- vi. Vaccine safety surveillance
- vii. Medical devices and diagnostics
- viii. Methods and reporting systems.
- ix. Documentation and record keeping (PSUR, PBRE, VigiFlow, VigiMobile, and VigiBase)
- x. Communication in the context of Pharmacovigilance

Learning outcomes

Expected outcomes of the course will be to equip trainees with knowledge and skills to detect, identify, report, and prevent ADRs, Adverse Events Following Immunization, Medication Errors, poor quality products, medical devices, and other related problems. Trainees will equally, gain the ability to coordinate pharmacovigilance activities in their working areas and prepare PV master files. Participants will also be able to conduct post-market surveillance of their registered pharmaceutical products and prepare PSUR or PBRE. Again, the participants will be able to use VigiFlow and VigiMobile.

Mode of instruction

A combination of approaches will be used including Lectures, assignments, discussions, demonstration case discussions, and hands-on.

Course faculty

This course will be delivered by highly qualified and experienced experts from **MUHAS** and **TMDA**. Pharmacovigilance experts from TMDA will share their experience and knowledge.

Interested?

This course is open to pharmaceutical personnel, medical doctors, nurses, academicians, researchers, graduates, and postgraduates from the medical field. Participants are expected to actively contribute to case study discussions and hands-on sessions.
