Introduction

The School of Public Health and Social Sciences at MUHAS, in partnership with the DOCEHTA project, is excited to invite applications for a professional training workshop on Key and Vulnerable Populations Research and Programming. This short-term course is designed to enhance the skills of personnel involved in research and service provision for key and vulnerable populations (KVP) within the context of the HIV epidemic. Participants will gain essential knowledge and skills in HIV epidemiology, community engagement, and research methods to support evidence-based HIV prevention efforts among KVP.

- Marginalization, stigma, and discrimination
- HIV epidemiology in KVP
- HIV prevention methods
- HIV prevention programming
- Access to health services
- Research in KVP

Who should attend?

The training is open to postgraduate students and researchers interested in KVP research, as well as individuals working in HIV prevention programs, including NGO employees, civil servants, and healthcare providers in HIV services. Early-career and mid-career researchers with an interest in HIV research and programming are also encouraged to apply.

Course fee
